SACRAMENTS

Baptism:

All arrangements, including confirmation of the date, must be made with the parish office.

Sponsors must provide proof of eligibility by a letter from their respective pastors, must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Communion and Confirmation. Sponsors, if married, must either be married in the Church or with the Church's permission. Parents must attend Baptismal Preparation, which is regularly scheduled throughout the year.

Marriage:

Arrangements must be made directly with the pastor at least 6 months before the date of the wedding. Marriage preparation is required and couples are asked to speak to the priest first before setting a date. Couples, rather than parents, should contact the priest. If either party was previously married, an annulment must be granted prior to the selection of a future wedding date.

Gospel

~ John 2:1-11 ~

Reflection

In John's Gospel, the first miracle and Jesus' public ministry begin at a wedding. At a certain point during the wedding feast at Cana, the wine runs out and Jesus' mother, Mary, tells him of the need for more wine. It's striking that Mary acts as an intercessor, a role she's known for to this day. This story tells us a lot about Mary. She's a person who's deeply concerned about the welfare of others, and she takes those concerns to her divine Son. In reply to his mother, Jesus declares that his "hour" has not yet come. The "hour" is identified as his passion, his death on the cross. Some scholars have seen the "hour" as a symbol for the Mass, where we renew the sacrifice of Christ on Calvary in our "hour." In the "hour" at Cana, Jesus changed the water into wine; at the "hour" of the Mass, Jesus changes wine into his Blood. We gather on the new Sabbath, on Sunday, for the Eucharist, the wedding feast of the Lamb (Revelation 19:7), the new Cana, where we drink the new wine, the Blood of Christ poured out for his bride, the Church.
